Reconciliation

The Texas Election Code now requires that the presiding judge of the central counting station attest to a written reconciliation of votes and voters (127.131f):

- At the close of tabulation on election day
- Again after counting late mail/provisional ballots (canvass)
- For primaries conducted jointly, you may either combine parties or have a form for each
- Post completed forms on your county website



Reconciliation

Compares the number of voters who cast valid ballots with the number of votes counted by your tabulation system

 - Voters minus rejected/pending ballots minus counted ballots

Section details



1 - Voters

Fill in the number of voters who participated in your election

1. Voters (from election rosters)	
A. In person voters	
B. By mail voters	
C. Total voters (A+B)	

- **In person:** from reports in TEAM, ePollbooks, voter history software, or rosters
 - Include provisional ballots if they are on your election night results reports

- **By Mail:** from the ballot transmittal form
 - Include any other ballots you report with mail ballots



2 – Rejected or pending ballots

Fill in the number of ballots not accepted for counting

2. Rejected or pending ballots (pending review, pending voter action, or rejected)	
D. Provisional ballots rejected or pending	
E. Mail ballots rejected or pending	
F. Total ballots rejected or pending (D+E)	

- **Provisional ballots**
 - Rejected by the Early Voting Ballot Board (EVBB)
 - Pending voter action (no ID voters)
 - Provisional ballots awaiting EVBB review

- **Mail ballots**
 - Rejected by the EVBB
 - Pending voter action (corrective action process)



3 – Counted ballots

Fill in the number of ballots counted by your tabulation software

3. Counted ballots (from tabulation software)	
G. In person ballots counted	
H. Mail ballots counted	
I. Total ballots counted (G+H)	

- If provisional ballots are included in your results reports, include them in box G
- Box I should match the total number of ballots cast on your results report
- Consider creating any custom reports you may need in advance



4 – Comparison of voters and counted ballots

- Compare the number of voters with the number of ballots counted

4 - Comparison (continued)

- Box C minus Box F gives you the number of voters who cast valid ballots
- Then subtract box I to compare the number of valid ballots to the number of ballots counted
- If there is a discrepancy, try to identify and resolve before central count adjourns



4 - Comparison (continued)

- Calculate the percentage to put the discrepancy into context
- Start with inner parentheses (Box C – box F)
- Divide Box J by that number
- Multiply by 100



4 - Comparison (continued)

- Add any notes that you think will help explain the difference between voters and votes
 - Attach explanation if needed



5 - Attestation

- Signed by the presiding judge of central count

6 – Ballots that could be added

- List ballots that may be added to the count between election day and canvass
- Gives the public a clear idea of what may change

N. Mail ballots not returned or pending voter action		O. Estimated Provisional ballots	



6 – Ballots that could be added (continued)

- Mail ballots either not returned or pending voter action
- Provisional ballots not yet reviewed by EVBB or pending voter action

Preliminary Election Reconciliation

Example



1. Voters (from election rosters)	
A. In person voters	12,000
B. By mail voters	1,000
C. Total voters (A+B)	13,000

2. Rejected or pending ballots (pending review, pending voter action, or rejected)	
D. Provisional ballots rejected or pending	100
E. Mail ballots rejected or pending	50
F. Total ballots rejected or pending (D+E)	150

3. Counted ballots (from tabulation software)	
G. In person ballots counted	11,899
H. Mail ballots counted	948
I. Total ballots counted (G+H)	12,847

4. Comparison of voters and counted ballots			
J. Difference between voters and ballots (C-F-I)	<u>3</u>	K. Difference as percentage of voters (J÷(C-F)*100)	<u>0.02</u> %
L. Notes:	<div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px;"> <p>In person: further research required</p> <p>Mail: two secrecy envelopes did not contain ballots</p> </div>

Canvass

- In person category is separated into early voting, election day, and provisional ballot totals
- Section 2 only lists rejected ballots
- Future webinar will cover differences in more detail

B. Election day in person check-ins	
C. Mail ballots received	
D. Provisional ballots submitted	
E. Total voters (A+B+C+D)	

2. Rejected ballots	
F. Mail ballots rejected	
G. Provisional ballots rejected	
H. Total ballots rejected (F+G)	

3. Counted ballots (from tabulation software)	
I. Early voting ballots counted	
J. Election day ballots counted	
K. Mail ballots counted	
L. Provisional ballots counted	
M. Total ballots counted (I+J+K+L)
